RESOURCES

We have so many resources available. We have a huge bank of publications at our UT Extension website. These cover crops, lawns, residential horticulture, livestock, family consumer topics, you name it we've probably got it. I'll share some links here. You can write these down or send me an email and I'll share the active link.

First, the catalog is at https://extension.tennessee.edu/publications/Pages/default.aspx This treasure has links to publications that are free. The first page will allow you to select by department, specific topic or by area of interest.

There is a link to the UT Institute of Agriculture's AgRearch publications database. This research is carried on in the labs and on the university's research farms located across the state.

This page will also provide a link to Tennessee State University publications. There is some good information found here.

I also use other universities to search for publications on research-based topics. I use only research-based information. And I prefer to use other universities in our area since we share climate, pests, production systems, livestock, plants, growing seasons, etc. We all cooperate on research and data and many publications are joint efforts.

Whether it's garden vegetables, field crops, weed control or livestock management, there is really good information available at no charge. SOIL TESTING

The samples are \$15 each and this will provide you with good information. We have the sample boxes and the information sheets. We send samples to the lab often, and we can get a copy of your results and help with the analysis.

Speaking of spring, I had a nice photo sent to me by Wayne Tucker from Flat Creek of a flowering plant that I thought I'd share. I've already had a buttercup picture with the typical yellow flower sent back in January. But this one is different.

Lenten rose (Helleborus x hybridus), a perennial belonging to the buttercup family, is not actually a rose. Its two-part common name refers to the plant's bloom season (around Lent) and the rose-like shape of its flower buds. It's valued for its early blooms of purple, red, yellow, green, blue, lavender, and pink, and its leathery evergreen foliage.
