I have two children, 7 grandchildren and 1 great grandchild. I was raised in Davidson County and moved to Lebanon in 1994. After graduation from Isaac Litton High School in 1968, I went to Watkins Institute to learn Key Punch. This is punching holes in a card that ran through a type of computer that read the cards information on it. After graduation, I worked for National Life Insurance Company to get my 1 year work experience before working for the State of Tennessee Personnel Department. I became a stay at home Mom until 1983. I worked for a property management company until 1986, when I went to work in my family's business for 20 years. From 1994 to 2006, I worked part time, then started working full time from 2006 to 2009 for a local sewing/machine center, where I learned to quilt in 1999. While working there, I start teaching basic sewing, then teaching other classes.

In 2009, I became the Manager of Viking Sewing Gallery in Mt Juliet, TN until I retired in 2015. After retiring, I helped in a machine embroidery club and later a sewing/quilting group.

I started volunteering in 2015 at Fiddlers Grove Historic Village in Lebanon, TN at the Wilson County Fairgrounds. In 2017, I was asked to form a sewing group linked with Fiddlers Grove. I do a lot of volunteering at Fiddlers Grove working with 4<sup>th</sup> grade school kids studying Tennessee history in Wilson County and surrounding counties for Pioneer Days. We dress in period clothing and show how people lived in the 1800's. We gear our program around the STEM system. I volunteer working in the Groves' General Store several days each week. We work with children of all ages, young and old.

I work with Shelly Barnes, our agent, volunteer for workshops for service projects and special interest workshops. My FCE club volunteers to work one of the cabins in Fiddlers Grove during the Wilson County Fair/Tennessee State fair. I'm the coordinator for getting workers to stay in the cabin.

I volunteer at the fairgrounds for the Wilson County Fair/Tennessee State Fair.

I enjoy FCE for the fellowship and friends I have made. I love all the great food we have at our meetings, we have lots of great cooks.
